Statement from Archbishop Richard Gagnon, Archbishop of Winnipeg, January 25, 2017 Cathedral Property Redevelopment

The recent article in the Winnipeg Free Press on proposed developments on the Cathedral property in the city of Winnipeg requires clarification. This proposal for the development of buildings on the downtown Cathedral property is a long term plan at the initial feasibility stage of development only. In order for any proposal to proceed, much consultation needs to occur among the people of the Archdiocese and the Cathedral as to design, the type of facilities, land use and funding. There are no plans to launch a capital fundraising campaign in the Archdiocese in the near future; all of these feasibility questions would need to be carefully assessed.

Thoughts from Pope Francis

Be joyful

Since it's in the title and first sentence, living joyfully is obviously a major theme of the message. Pope Francis does not hide his own joy, and he encourages Christians to renew their encounter with Jesus, our source of joy. At the same time, the pope reminds us that joy does not mean a life free of distress, but rather a life rooted in the hope of the Resurrection.

With Christ joy is constantly born anew (*Evangelii Gaudium*, sec. 1).

The gospel joy which enlivens the community of disciples is a missionary joy (*Evangelii*, sec. 21). Finally an evangelizing community is filled with joy; it knows how to rejoice always. It celebrates every small victory, every step forward in the work of evangelization (sec. 24).

Challenges exist to be overcome! Let us be realists, but without losing our joy, our boldness and our hope-filled commitment. Let us not allow ourselves to be robbed of missionary vigour! (sec. 109).
