## <u>Palms</u>

Ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year, which we will use on Ash Wednesday. The ashes are christened with Holy Water and are scented by exposure to incense. While the ashes symbolize penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts. His Divine mercy is of utmost importance during the season of Lent, and the Church calls on us to seek that mercy during the entire Lenten season with reflection, prayer and penance.

There is a basket at the church entrance to place last year's palms in. Anyone who did not yet bring their palms can drop them off at 4 Piper Bay in Elie before Wednesday.

### **Stations of the Cross**

The Stations of the Cross is a popular devotion used by individuals or groups in our parish, who wish through prayer and reflection, to follow Jesus Christ on his journey to Calvary. It is one of the most important devotions honouring the passion of Jesus. We invite you to attend and participate in the Stations of the Cross, beginning February 24<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. and every Friday throughout the Lenten season. What matters most in the Stations of the Cross is to follow Jesus Christ in his passion and to see ourselves mirrored in him.
