"Claiming the Dignity of Cremated Remains." Presentation April 26th, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. St François Xavier Church

At a time when the secular world offers 'twenty seven things to do with cremated remains', we can easily be overwhelmed by the many different options presented to us when a loved one dies. These influences have led some of our Catholic faithful to disperse or scatter remains, or keep them at home indefinitely. The teachings of the Church instruct us to treat cremated remains with the same respect as the body, including the manner in which they are reverenced and the attention given to their transport and final placement. When cremation is chosen, the entire ritual movement of the Order of Christian Funerals should be celebrated. This session will delve into the rituals supporting death, and the consolation of faith made present through the complete celebration of this ritual movement when cremation is chosen.
