Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada: Why is there such a collection?

Every year, the Bishops of Canada make an appeal for financial assistance to support their work and the work of each diocese by means of the Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada. The President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), the Most Reverend Paul-André Durocher, Archbishop of Gatineau, has described this Collection as "an opportunity to all the faithful to help their dioceses collaborate in financing the regional episcopal assemblies (the Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario, and the West) and also the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB). These associations support the Bishops in their local ministry and in working together on issues of common concern." Any additional revenues raised help the diocese support its own diocesan pastoral programs and other activities.

The Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada will be held September 26 and 27, 2015.

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Blessed Sacrament Parish Funeral Lunches

In view of all the funeral lunches we have had in Blessed Sacrament Parish this past month, the leaders of the lunch groups would like to express their sincerest gratitude for the generous donations of food and money. Funeral lunches are one of the few fund-raising activities of the parish. Without everyone's generosity we could not realize any gain for the parish.

Our lunch groups are becoming smaller and smaller and we are asking if there is anyone in the parish who is not now on one of the groups and would like to be included, to please come forward to any one of the group leaders and have your name added to the list.

The matter of food or lack thereof can be covered from the monetary donations, however the matter of assistance to get the lunch ready and to serve it is a concern. Oftentimes it is the same group of ladies who come to help before the funeral preparing the buns, pickles, dainties, coffee, etc. and we are very appreciative of them. Help is also needed throughout the lunch to make sure the tables are replenished and that everything is kept clean and presentable. After the lunch is over more help is needed for the cleanup. The leftovers have to be gathered and packaged for the family of the deceased. The dishes and tables have to be washed. The hall has to be cleaned and left in the same way that we found it. We would like to encourage men to give us a hand in serving and especially for cleanup. We now have a good group of men who set up tables and chairs and fill and place the coffee urns. This is much appreciated.

We understand that some ladies are still working outside of the home and aren't available to help when funerals occur on weekdays. We ask that these ladies make themselves available to help at Saturday funerals even if it isn't their group's turn for the lunch. Hopefully in the end others will help when it's not their turn and it will all even out.
