Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada: An Act of Solidarity!

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) is mandated by the Holy See and the Bishops of Canada to assist dioceses and their Bishops in a number of areas of pastoral life: faith formation, doctrine, ecumenical dialogues, international relations, interreligious conversations, liturgy, relations with Indigenous Peoples, social justice, and building a culture of life and family.

In his letter to the parishes across the country in which he explains the Collection, CCCB President Archbishop Paul-André Durocher of Gatineau points out that this year Collection is being held while a number of families from Canada are participating to the World Meeting of Families in Philadelphia, in response to an invitation from Pope Francis. In addition, the General Synod of Bishops on the family will soon begin. "This twofold coincidence reminds us of the importance of families as part of the Church's mission and as part of the work of the national conference and the regional assemblies. The Church's commitment to families is one more reason why all the faithful in our country will want to ensure the collection's success through their generosity and solidarity," the CCCB President writes.

St .Eustache "Baie St. Paul" Old Cemetery Project

History of St. Eustache Parish started on the south bank of the Assiniboine River known as Baie St. Paul. Records indicate that 212 persons were buried on that site, however only two tombstones are indicated on the old cemetery site cairn. Four smaller cairns constructed by Mr. St. Cyr mark the four corners of the cemetery with the names of the four oldest families—Allard, Desjardins, Fleury and Leclerc. The two north cairns are underway with repairs as one was struck down by a road accident (Autopac will cover the cost of one cairn) and the other is in need of repair due to road erosion. (Cost is \$1798.00.) Thank you to *J. Lamoureux Construction* for taking on this project.
