#### OCTOBER 16th INTER-DEANERY CELEBRATION

You are invited to participate in the Winnipeg Inter-Deanery Celebration to be held on **Thursday, October 16, 2014 at St. Paul the Apostle Church** (2400 Portage Avenue, Winnipeg) beginning with **Mass at 7:30 p.m.**, presided by Archbishop Richard Gagnon, followed by a reception in the parish hall. The scriptural theme for the evening is drawn from the Gospel for the day's liturgical memorial of Saint Marguerite d'Youville: "Just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40). We have invited Tom Denton of Hospitality House to speak on some of our efforts throughout the Archdiocese to welcome refugees to Canada. This inter-deanery event is a celebration in thanksgiving to honour the completion of the ten year pastoral plan "Building a Church of Communion" (LITURGY – FAITH FORMATION – STEWARDSHIP – COMMUNITY BUILDING) and a step in the journey towards the celebration of our Archdiocesan Centennial Year.

#### OCTOBER IS DEDICATED TO OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

#### What is the ROSARY?

"According to Catholic lore, the Rosary was given to us by MARY HERSELF."

Originating from the Latin word for "crown of roses" or "rose garden" (rosarium), the Rosary is a cherished Catholic devotion of prayerful meditation on the life of Jesus and Mary. Through recitation, the Rosary reviews 20 different scriptural events or moments in the lives of Jesus and Mary; these moments or events are grouped into what are known as "Mysteries": the Joyful Mysteries, the Sorrowful Mysteries, the Glorious Mysteries, and (since introduced by Pope John Paul II in 2002) the Luminous Mysteries, prayed on different days of the week. The Rosary consists of prayer recitations known as "decades," with each decade made up of a series of prayers that include one Our Father, 10 Hail Marys, and one Glory Be. A rosary has beads representing five sets of decades (one decade for each event in the day's Mysteries) that are designed to help the person who's praying physically keep track of their recitation while they say the prayers and meditate on the Mysteries.

The tradition of the Rosary likely developed over the centuries during the medieval period. According to Catholic lore, however, the Rosary was given to us by Mary herself, when, as Our Lady of the Rosary, she appeared to St. Dominic in 1208 and presented him with rosary beads.
